GENE'S foundation.

GENE NOW STANDS ON SOLID GROUND.

The hallways at Peter Mulvey Place are exceptionally cheerful. Bright, floral wreaths decorate many of the doorways – all hand-crafted by a generous resident of Neighborhood Homes – Gene.

The residents at Peter Mulvey Place are a very lucky group. Not only do they live in safe, secure and affordable apartments in a superb location, they have Gene. A former window decorator for Charles A. Stevens Co., and a retired doorman who worked in a Lake Shore Drive high-rise for 19 years, Gene brings his artistic creativity and service sensitivity to Peter Mulvey Place.

There's an annual Christmas tree stunningly trimmed – donated by Gene. New residents move in and they are welcomed to the Peter Mulvey Place community by Gene, who makes sure they are introduced to

their new neighbors. He also serves as his floor captain, checking to be sure everyone's "I'm ok" signs are posted each morning.

As Gene began to look toward retirement, he realized that he would have to find more affordable housing to make ends meet. A friend through the Presbyterian Church was living at Peter Mulvey Place and encouraged Gene to apply. After several years on the waiting list, an apartment finally was available for Gene. "The moment I walked in the door, I knew it was perfect," said Gene about visiting his one-bedroom apartment for the first time.

"I'm so grateful to be here. It's easy to help out and give back in any way I can."



It was the mission of our founders in 1904 to establish a home for older adults with limited financial means. Today, the Geneva Foundation of Presbyterian Homes is helping more than 125 low-income older adults remain in the communities they call home.

THE CIDS CAN STRENGTHEN THEIR FAMILY.

The life of Malena and Victor Cid is like so many other older adults today. The proud parents of two daughters and five grandchildren, their lives are filled with the joy of family and the warmth of neighbors and friends.

It could have been so different. Originally from Mexico City, the Cids spent many years traveling back and forth to Chicago where their daughters live. Several years ago, they relocated to Chicago to be with family. Yet, the hardworking Cids found themselves facing retirement years without the financial security others enjoy. Malena and Victor attend the Presbyterian Church in Ravenswood where Victor serves as a church Elder. It was at church that a friend told them about the Neighborhood Homes Program.

"It was a blessing," said Malena. The couple rents a cheerful one-bedroom apartment in Peter Mulvey Place in Lakeview at a modest

fee, without having to move away from family, friends, and their church.

Now Malena can babysit her grandchildren while her daughters are working. Victor, a retired accountant, often helps out at daughter Laura's bakery – Bombon, a growing business with four locations in the Hispanic community.

In the two years the Cids have lived at Peter Mulvey Place, they have enjoyed parties, picnics and bingo with their neighbors. Last winter, Malena fell on black ice and broke her ankle. "My neighbors were always looking in on me, sending cards, cooking a meal, offering to help out," explained Malena. "This is not just a building, it is a community. We are so happy and blessed to live here."

Malena and Victor have clearly found a home.



The Neighborhood Homes program provides subsidized rental buildings located in Lakeview, Rogers Park (in Chicago) and Lake County. These programs are privately supported with approximately 12% of the Geneva Foundation budget. There are but a handful of not-for-profit senior communities in America that offer a similar program.

A WORKING FAMILY FINDS PEACE OF MIND.

Marie Jamruszka tells her family, “I have to go to work,” as she anticipates the arrival of the bus that takes her to Great Opportunities, the adult day service program that is supported by the Geneva Foundation. “Even on Saturdays she gets ready to go,” laughs her daughter Karen Hyman. “She always seems a bit disappointed when we say, ‘Mom, it’s the weekend. You have a few days off.’”

Taking time off is something that doesn’t come naturally to Marie, a 92-year-old mother of four and grandmother to five. Marie worked as a waitress at Marshall Field’s downtown for 35 years. “She loved it,” said daughter Karen. “She is such a social person. Her life has always been filled with activities, friends and family. She loved to be outside, working in her flower garden.”

About five years ago, Karen noticed that her mom’s health was deteriorating. She was becoming forgetful – leaving the phone off the hook. After living in her

own home for 49 years, Marie moved in with Karen, her husband Richard and their two children. Karen, now a school nurse who had worked as an ER nurse at Skokie Hospital for years, had often called upon her mom to help sit for the kids while she worked. Marie’s husband passed away 13 years ago, and most of her family and friends were gone. Karen hated to see her mom by herself during the day, but she and her husband had to work.

“Great Opportunities was an answer to our prayers. The bus picks up mom at 7:30 a.m., and I bring her home around 3:30 p.m.,” explained Karen. “She loves it there. She gets to work with the plants in the greenhouse, enjoy an art project, and share a cup of coffee with a friend. It gives her life purpose.”

Karen said her mom can find the good in anything. Together, they found the good in Great Opportunities.



Great Opportunities, located in the community area of a small church in Skokie, IL, offers an extraordinary number of programs and services. For a nominal monthly fee, some 30 vulnerable older adults each day can connect and engage through a professionally led program of current events, art projects, socialization, and even tai chi!





A COMMUNITY'S foundation.

A PLACE WHERE NO ONE FALLS THROUGH THE CRACKS.

Walk through any of our communities. There are moments of connection everywhere you turn. You may be greeted by a warm hello, a gentle inquiry about a friend's health or a little laughter over a shared moment of joy. What you may not notice is another connection that lives on every campus of Presbyterian Homes. It's the Geneva Foundation's Fellowship Fund.

More than 100 years ago, Presbyterian Homes was founded as a place where after a lifetime of hard work and devotion, older adults with limited financial means could live with dignity and grace. Certainly the world and Presbyterian Homes have changed since then. But our mission continues to be a spirit that prevails on every campus.

The Fellowship Fund makes it possible for older adults with limited means to live on our campuses. It also supports residents who have endured serious economic setbacks and allows them to remain on campus.

People supported by the Fellowship Fund walk among us. They are actively engaged in the communities where they live. They volunteer, work out in the fitness center, attend lectures, read in the library, take classes, create in the fine arts studio, and enjoy a meal with friends in a café.

The identities of those receiving support from the Fellowship Fund remain anonymous. Yet, their presence says more about the generous spirit that prevails at Presbyterian Homes than words can express.



There are teachers, carpenters, social workers, and health care providers who, through no fault of their own, find themselves facing retirement without a financial safety net. About 69% of Geneva Foundation funding is used to support these vulnerable adults, residents of our communities who have lost or outlived their assets, and residents who require constant medical attention that exceeds their financial means.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

Three new capital improvement projects are underway at Presbyterian Homes. Each project is funded by an individual donor. These projects allow us to continue to provide state-of-the-art health care on our campuses and sustain our leadership in the industry.



McGaw Pavilion

The McGaw Care Center, located on our Westminster Place campus, is getting ready for a \$5 million addition. The new Murdough Pavilion will improve accessibility and delivery of health care services. This represents the first in a series of plans to renovate the current McGaw facility.

Memory Care Support Center

Lake Forest Place has the opportunity to strengthen its reputation for excellence in memory support. An anonymous donor presented a challenge to the Geneva Foundation: "Raise \$2 million dollars toward building a new memory care support center, and in return, I will give a \$2 million gift to completely fund the project."

Presbyterian Homes and the Geneva Foundation have embarked on a new campaign to raise the first \$2 million. When completed, the state-of-the-art memory care center will be reminiscent of a resident's home and will feature industry leading design and innovations in programming.

Lake Forest Place Resident Community Garden

Lake Forest Place residents will once again have a robust and blooming garden filled with delicious vegetables and beautiful flowers. A new community garden with 96 garden plots will be located on the grounds of Lake Forest Hospital.

The garden is scheduled to be completed sooner than projected, thanks to a generous donor. Look for the ribbon cutting this fall.



NEW HOPE SCHOLARSHIPS

Many employees of Presbyterian Homes dream of going to college or continuing their studies, but weren't given the opportunity in life or had obstacles in their way. The New Hope Scholarship Program is a resident-driven initiative which awards scholarship funding to lighten the financial burden to employees pursuing their dreams of continuing education.

Last year, 87 scholarships were awarded for a total of \$95,000! This wonderful scholarship allows Presbyterian Homes employees to focus on learning.



SECOND CENTURY CAMPAIGN CONCLUDES

For more than 100 years, Presbyterian Homes has remained faithful to its mission to provide services for older adults from diverse social and economic backgrounds. Presbyterian Homes entered its second century of service in 2004 and with it, journeyed into a capital campaign to endow the future of its mission of service.

Many donors, who we call "Second Century Fund Pioneers," stepped forward to answer the challenge. These pioneers contributed financial resources to build a Second Century Fund Endowment. This willingness to step forward helped to endow mission opportunities long into our future.

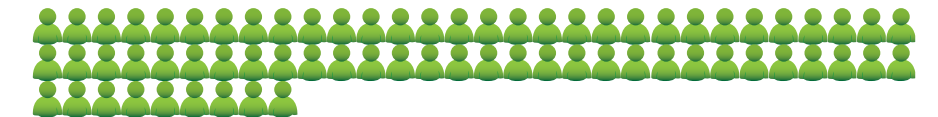

Through our Fellowship Fund, we ensure that no resident will be asked to leave our community due to inability to pay. We extend medical and supportive services to maintain their security, health, dignity and self-esteem. We also extend this benevolence to those who wish to reside in our communities but have not developed adequate financial resources to do so.

In 1904 Presbyterian Homes was founded as an act of benevolence and grace to provide a home for impoverished older adults. 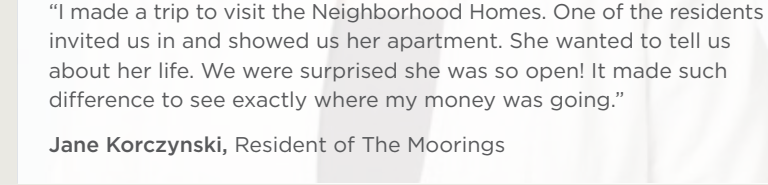

As you are aware, Uncle Lindy was a resident at Crowder Place from 1998 until his death in January 2011.


